Director's Corner

It was near mid-September that we stood in awe of the murals adorning the walls of St. Benedict's Painted Church. During a guided tour of this quaint church building in the coffee plantation region of Kona, Hawaii, the parish curator weaved the chronology about how these marvelous paintings had come to be around 1900. He told about how Belgian Pipcus Fr. John Velghe self-taught himself to paint and rendered artwork on the walls of the church to evangelize the then-mostly illiterate local Hawaiian population.

The curator explained how the artist-pastor painted

six "good" and "bad" scenes from the Bible and Church theology and history. The powerful artwork ranged from a rendering of Jesus violently casting down the tempting devil, to portrayal of a serene death awaiting a bedridden Hawaiian amidst the hopeful rays of heaven.

At the end of the presentation, I intoned the praise song "The Lord Is

in This Place." About the half-dozen members of my choir imbedded among our small tourist group joined in unison, repeating these lyrics a few times: "The Lord is in this place. Come and worship, the Lord is in this place." We continued, in splendid harmony, with a rousing: "He is in this place" and concluded calmly in unison with "Come and worship, the Lord is in this place." A brief, ensuing silence punctuated tears of gratitude at the union of sight and sound.

This represented yet another "ah-ha" transformative moment in our lives as pastoral musicians. In the realm of gospel music, where I spend most of my musical life in the Church, these moments occur regularly as the Spirit intervenes spontaneously.

NPM president Fr. Rick Hilgartner addressed our annual Liturgy Day a year ago on the transformative power of music. "Music has the power to touch our

hearts," he said, invoking the encounter of the disciples and the Lord on the road to Emmaus as "the model of something that is a transformative experience."

"Transformation is always about the mind and the heart," said Dr. Carolyn Woo in July at our NPM convention in Houston, offering her keen insights as president and CEO of global humanitarian Catholic Relief Services. "And it's always about transformation toward God, from an alienation from God to a desire for wholeness and for joy in God and seeking that wholeness. It is about going from self-will to God's will. It's about being more

Christ-like in the way we think of others, in the way we approach and treat others."

She concluded her address, entitled *Transformation through Mission*, by noting that "mission is the outpouring of God's love in action to all in this place and at this time, wherever we are."



The Lord was in this place and time in Hawaii – thoroughly connected to Fr. John's brush strokes of transformation through mission a century ago. My pastoral musical "light" had turned on as I sat transfixed in the pews of the Painted Church.

May we all be so blessed to allow these transformative moments to lead and guide each of us every day, in every way along our parish musical journey.


