







DIRECTOR'S CORNER

Welcome to our new program year!

With the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, planning for music ministry this fall has been a challenge. The various social distancing requirements and other precautions make choral singing unrealistic. Even congregational singing presents challenge: singing while wearing a mask, singing without hymnals, and accompanying extended Communion processions due to the added safety precautions. How do we plan? How do we pray? How can we sing? These are questions each of us will need to pray over in the months to come.

Given the challenges and opportunities at the parish level, your local NPM boards have been grappling with how to program NPM events for this year. We're talking about some virtual gatherings or virtual workshops. Maybe some in-person events in the Spring. This much is clear - we want to stay connected with you, help you as we can, and continue to journey in pastoral ministry with you!

So much has happened since our Summer edition: **Eugene Harper** has completed his term as Arlington's Chapter Director and continues to serve on the board. **Tim Lewicki** (that's me!) has agreed to serve as Chapter Director for NPM Arlington, which means we also have a new Newsletter Editor. It is my privilege to serve our local chapter as its director. In my full-time parish work, I minister at All Saints Catholic Church in Manassas, VA, where I oversee the music program of ten choirs, in three languages, for all ages! The success of this ministry is partially

due to the witness and support of others, especially in times like these. Part of the great mystery of the Communion of Saints, as St. Paul reminds us, is this "great cloud of witnesses" who help us to endure the race in times of distress or trial (*cf.* Hebrews 12:1).
